## From the Rector

HERE'S A BIT OF EXCITING NEWS! One of your fellow St. Luke's parish family members (who, at this time, wishes to remain anonymous) has decided to make some donations to this church for the purpose of establishing a *permanent endowment fund* to provide from the interest earned education scholarship money for needy individuals. We're still at the beginning of this process, and it will probably take another year before all of the funds are in place, but when all is said and done we expect to have about \$95,000 in this endowment fund. And then, we'll want to wait another year for those funds to begin earning interest. And although there is still much work to be done in this process, we are off to a good start.

I'm excited about all this for more than the obvious reasons. For the last several years, the people of St. Luke's in particular, and our parish in general, has been developing a reputation for being a *giving church*. Not only do each of you support the mission and ministry of this parish, but you also go above and beyond to support individuals and ministries outside our parish. Let me see if I can list most of the ways in which we provide financial support for others: Episcopal Renewal and Development (to support the Millennium Development Goals), Episcopal Community Services, St. Paul's Food Pantry, Breakfast at St. Paul's, Community-Linc, Cross-Lines, and Angel Tree. And, along with these, our Agapé Outreach funds have assisted many individuals and families who otherwise might have fallen through the cracks. And, last but not least, your donations to the Rector's Discretionary Fund, have been used to provide financial assistance in very small amounts to help people purchase groceries or pay bills. And if all this wasn't enough, in a couple of years we're going to add an educational endowment fund. Now, no matter who you are, you have to admit that this is pretty exciting stuff. And it's all because of you, and your generosity.

OUR ANNUAL PARISH MEETING is taking place on Sunday, January 27. We'll gather in the parish hall between the two morning worship services. Among other things, you're going to be electing three new Vestry members, and a new Parish Delegate and Alternate Delegate, all of whom will be serving three-year terms. The three "retiring" vestry members are Senior Warden Debbie Fowler, Junior Warden Tom Grandgenett, and Marilyn Lyon. The retiring

Delegates are Marcia Streepy and Kate Wood. Each of these five people have been invaluable in their service to St. Luke's, and there is no way in which I can adequately express my gratitude to them. So, I hope they will allow me to say simply, and inadequately, "Thank you, and God bless you!"

THIS YEAR, EASTER TAKES PLACE ON MARCH 23<sup>RD</sup>, which is just about the absolute earliest date possible. And that means that Ash Wednesday is nearly upon us: February 6<sup>th</sup>. So you need to set aside the four or five Tuesdays in Lent and plan to attend our *Tuesday Evenings in Lent* program. But, in addition to our evening program, I'm going to offer something during the day; perhaps something in the nature of prayers, brief study, and brown-bag lunch. There'll be more about this later.

I WOULD BE REMISS if I didn't take a moment to express my thanks and gratitude to Vicki Penny, and the members of the choir. This past Christmas season has been especially grueling, with so many different worship services taking place one after another. At every opportunity, they all performed brilliantly, and added so much to our worship experiences. Thank you all so much.

A FINAL THOUGHT COMES TO MIND. I'm probably more in tuned with the "recent unpleasantness" between The Episcopal Church and a few other members of the Anglican Communion. It's all very distressing, and certainly unnecessary. Dan Wheatcroft sent me a quote from William Sloan Coffin, Jr., a Presbyterian/UCC minister. All who are up in arms within the Anglican Communion would do well to meditate upon these thoughts:

"There are those who prefer certainty to truth, those in church who put the purity of dogma before the integrity of love. And what distortion of the gospel it is to have limited sympathies and unlimited certainties, when the very reverse – to have limited certainties and unlimited sympathies – is not only more tolerant but far more Christian."

May God's peace be with you all in this coming year.
